



Dear Resident,

Cape Argus Pick n Pay Cycle Tour - Impact of the Cycle Tour from Steenberg Road to Boyes Drive and from Atlantic Road to Clairvaux Rd

Some 35,000 cyclists will cycle along the Cape Peninsula on Sunday, 13 March 2011, when they participate in the world's largest timed cycle race.

We realise that many non-participants will be affected by the road closures and traffic delays on Race Day, but they are essential to ensure the safety of all. We would therefore like to thank you for your tolerance.

Please note that the measures outlined below were designed in close co-operation with the traffic department of the City of Cape Town, who, together with our own marshals will be on active duty to ensure the Cycle Tour proceeds safely and with as little disruption as possible.

Road Closures

We realise that Muizenberg and Kalk Bay and residents are especially affected by this event and that you will be cut off from early morning until early afternoon on race day. If you do need to travel between 06:16 and 13:00 on 13 March 2011, please make alternative arrangements to use other routes in advance. The map at the end of this letter indicates the alternative routes out of the area.

The following road closures may affect you:

- Main Road between Steenberg Road and Boyes Drive at Westlake Arms will be closed from 06:15 to 12:15 in both directions. The reopening will be controlled by the City's Traffic Department.
- Main Road, South of Boyes Drive from Westlake Arms, will remain two-way and open with kerb side parking.
- Main Road adjacent to the road works between Muizenberg and Kalk Bay will remain one way southbound only, with parking; **however there will be no exit at Clairvaux for the duration of the cycle tour through this area. (06:16 to 13:00)**
- Residents or visitors to this area will have to remain there until Clairvaux Road is reopened. An alternative to this is to leave ones vehicle at a position north of St James Station which will allow return access to the north and east.
- The one way traffic system will only become operational again after 13:00 when Main Road to Fishoek has been reopened.

Parking

- **Main Road:** No parking at all will be allowed along Main Road between Steenberg Road and Boyes Drive and from Clairvaux Road to Fishoek. The traffic authorities will remove any vehicles still parked on Main Road at 04:00 on 13 March.
- **Boyes Drive:** Please do not park on Boyes Drive – from the Main Road turn-off at Lakeside to Clairvaux Road – between 19:00 on Saturday, 12 March, and 13:00 on Sunday, 13 March.

Environmental Impact

The Cycle Tour has a comprehensive Environmental Management Plan. This aims to ensure that the negative impacts of noise, litter and general disruption to the community are minimised. The following areas receive particular attention:

- No music will be played at any refreshment station until the first cyclists arrive.
- Refuse collection is carried out continually throughout the day and a waste sweep vehicle follows the last cyclists to ensure that refuse is removed from the course.
- All structures that might obstruct the flow of traffic will be removed immediately after the event. Any supporting structures will be removed within 72 hours thereafter.
