SUBGROUPS

1 Early Childhood Development Forum

The ECD Forum and Seedlings Project are guided by the Masiphumelele Corporation (Masi Corp) and have grown out of research conducted into the needs of Masiphumelele Educare Centres by ECD Stakeholder Forum and Masi Corp. The inclusive ECD forum meets quarterly to share and discuss information and facilitate collaboration in the area of Early Childhood Development.

ECD Forum aims to:

- Make connections with others working in the same field
- Foster opportunities for collaborations
- Learn from the experience of others
- Identify funding opportunities
- Minimise duplication on ECD so that the work is streamlined
- Address issues associated with registration

2 Disaster Distress Relief Work Group

The purpose of this group is to create a working group of individuals and organisations that will actively participate in the coordinated implementation of risk reduction and response measures and programs that can positively impact on the health and safety of the Masiphumelele community.

The primary risks confronting the Masiphumelele community are those of Fire and Health:

A Projects addressing Fire Risks include:

- Establishment of volunteer fire-fighting groups
- Provision of specialised fire-fighting equipment
- Employment of fire monitors (look-outs)
- Training volunteers and community members
- Fire Safety workshops at home
- Fire Safety workshops at school
- Reducing the external fire-risk
- Exploring effectiveness of latest fire-fighting products, methods, etc.
- Mass care of persons affected by disasters.

B Projects addressing Health Risks include:

1 SOLID WASTE

- · Regular cleaning of canals
- Providing sufficient facilities to dispose of household waste
- Providing sufficient facilities to dispose of bulk waste

- Timely clean-up/collection of bulk waste disposal points eg containers
- Develop effective waste management plan for backyard dwellers
- More efficient waste collection plan for wetland bulk disposal areas

2 TOILET & WATER POINTS

- Ensure adequate installation of accessible toilets and water points
- · Effective implementation and management of toilet and tap plan i.e. maintenance, repair and cleaning programs
- Effective implementation and management of night soil disposal plan including backyard dwellers
- Effective implementation and management plan for grey water disposal (backyard dwellers)

3 WASH ROOM FACILITIES

- Ensure installation of adequate numbers of wash room facilities
- Effective management of grey water from taps and wash room and laundry facilities

4 TRAINING AND EDUCATION

Broad-based, awareness-building campaigns

5 TOPIC-SPECIFIC PROGRAMS

- Personal hygiene
- · Grey water management
- · Night soil management
- Waste / Refuse management
- Home owner tap and toilet repair.

3 Community Support Network

The Masiphumelele Community Support Network initiative is driven by an understanding that the current level of poverty and unemployment crisis exist not only due to insufficient services, training opportunities and jobs but, perhaps more importantly, a lack of awareness of how to identify and access productive assets, skills and infrastructure.

We aim to create an information resource centre and unified community development organisations whose target beneficiaries share responsibility for their ownership and development with the stakeholders. Our approach aims to be peoplecentred, process-oriented and sustainable.

As established NGO's, we seek to integrate emerging Masiphumelele community-based non-profit organisations in order to collectively upgrade the human development potential of the community and consequently, to uplift the standard of living in this poverty-stricken community.

This could be achieved through the following:

- 1 Educate by means of capacity-building workshops and trainings especially for emerging NPOs.
- 2 Develop effective institutional infrastructure and databases that promotes inter-sectorial operations, provides better community self-help development services and encourages funding, employment and economic development.
- 3 Provide an information, resource and referral centre that also conducts community based needs assessments and relays the gathered needs information to the NPO Forum.

In order to better address the pervasive problems that lead to poverty and disempowerment we also seek to identify the behavioural norms of those individuals whose unusual practices and strategies have led to greater success than neighbours who have had access to the same resources. How can we discern and promote these positive behavioural norms and how do we make the many available resources more accessible to the wider community?
